Presentation (200 points)

Much of what you say in you classroom presentation is repeated in the written report. The attached paper provides a good model of what a research report looks like. The basic format for the report is as follows:

- 1. Title is centered at the top of the first page.
- 2. Your name, class hour and the date centered under title.
- 3. Double space the report which results in no more that 25 double spaced lines per page.
- 4. Use 1 inch left and right margins.
- 5. Include page footer with page number.
- 6. Divide your report into 5 sections: Introduction, Method, Results, Discussion, and References. Failing to follow these guidelines or failing to type/word process the report results in an automatic loss of 50 points.
 - Introduction (100 points): Describe the behavior you tried to modify, how often it occurred before
 the intervention, and why you wanted to modify this behavior. Also include in this discussion any
 related research that might be appropriate.
 - Method (50 points): Clear, concise description of your intervention. This includes how you
 collected baseline and intervention data, what reinforcers or punishers were used, when they
 were used, and other people who were involved in the project.

- Results (50 points): Present your data and describe as simply as possible what changes, if any, occurred in the behavior you were attempting to modify. Data from each week must be presented here. Leave any side comments or speculation for the discussion.
- Discussion (100 points): This is the section where you discuss the results. If the results were as
 expected, explain how this has changed you life. If the results were unexpected or no change
 occurred, speculate about reasons why the intervention did not work and what you would do
 differently next time to make it work.
- References (50 points): Use the attached paper as a model for your references. References include books, magazine articles, Internet resources and relevant conversations you have had with people.
